- 1. Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. Adoption of minutes from previous LSS PAC meeting
 - Motion by Natalie, second by Jen
- 3. Administration Report:
 - Community Christmas breakfast went well. Staff was there at 5:30 in the morning cooking and getting everything ready.
 - A few families that came, which was great, but it would be nice to see more of the community come next year;
 - Hopefully, with this being an annual thing, we'll get more and more families;
 - Lots of food left over which was taken to H.D. Stafford;
 - Semester one is finished on January 25, 2023. Transition days coming up for January 27, 30;
 - Taste of LSS is on January 31, 2023. Grade eights from Stafford will come to LSS on this date;
 - Semester two starts on February 1, 2023;
 - Timetables have been sent home;
 - Students are able to make appointments if they need any changes but knowing that the timetable is pretty tight;
 - Course selection starts in a couple of weeks;
 - Parent evening with grade 8 Stafford students is scheduled for February 7, 2023 at 6 p.m., presentation in the small gym followed by a tour, following this will be a presentation for grade 9 to 11 students/parents

- regarding course selection, getting ready for graduation and thinking of post secondary school;
- · Students should be coming home with a course selection sheet;
- Will put PAC meetings in Scoop and on website

4. President's Report:

- Received email from Crossroads Collective (counselling) advising they
 have no wait list for their clinic if families/students are in need of
 counselling.
- Received positive emails from Teachers in response to funding requests.

5. Treasurer's Report:

- Last November 2021, the LSS admin received invoices from teachers, pursuant to funding requests made.
- Invoices were put in by teachers, however, due to a changeover in admin staff these invoices were not sent to the LSS PAC treasurer.
- Due to the above, an invoice for jerseys in the amount of \$9,000 and an invoice for a pitching maching in the amount of \$1,800 machine were just received. These expenses had been approved last year but the invoices were inadvertently never sent to PAC. The invoices must now be paid and therefore \$9,000 for the jerseys will come out of gaming and \$1,800 for the pitching machine will come out of the general account.
- There will still be funds to carry forward to next year, albeit not as much;
- Gaming account is \$35,000, general account is \$7,500. Will be less after the outstanding cheques are written.

- Presentation: Safe Schools and Student Wellness
- School liaisons work in partnership for the success of all students: goal is to support all family schools and staff
- Values connections with one another, parents and community partners to meet the mandate of supporting student families and staff.
- Have regular interaction with the RCMP and all students in order to normalize the relationship;
- PACs are encouraged to share info about SLO program and the liaison officer at their school via newsletters or social media

- Bridging events like "coffee with a cop" or "meet the police" would help foster positive interactions
- Incidents at school involving police and communication to parents are being reviewed on a case by case basis. Privacy, investigation, attention seeking...no one policy is applicable in every situation;
- Mal Gill, SD 35 Superintendent, meeting with various groups to review the 4 year strategic plan to receive feedback and take it to the education meeting in March. Then at the end of April to the public.
- Uncertified TTOCs short TTOCs in classrooms so VPs and Principals are not covering classes. All are term (temp) positions and no uncertified TTOCs can post into permanent positions.
- Collective Agreements moving forward. No job actions. Good news.
- Enhancement Agreement working through this with First Nation.
