

## A GUIDE TO YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING UPDATE (SECONDARY)



The B.C. curriculum is flexible and focuses on literacy, numeracy, and the First Peoples Principles of Learning. The curriculum also supports deeper learning through concept-based and competencydriven education. The goal of the curriculum is to support the development of educated citizens who are critical and creative thinkers and communicators, and who are personally and socially responsible in all areas of their lives.

The curriculum supports the ways in which students think, learn, and grow, and prepares them for a lifetime of successful learning in a world where change is constant.

#### CORE COMPETENCIES







The use of the Provincial Proficiency Scale (Grades K-9) or letter grades and percentages (Grades 10-12) gives students, parents, and caregivers a clear understanding of what students can already do and areas for future

### growth. The four-point Provincial Proficiency Scale is used to communicate student learning in all areas of learning. The four points on the scale are Emerging, Developing, Proficient, and Extending.

### **INSUFFICIENT EVIDENCE (IE):**

Insufficient Evidence (IE) is used to alert parents, caregivers, and students when, for a variety of reasons, a student have not provided sufficient evidence of learning in relation to the learning standards. This means that teachers do not have enough information to adequately assess the student.

A student's needs and goals should be considered before assigning an IE.

### Here are some examples of when an IE might be used:

A student has recently moved to a new school or district (i.e. arriving a few weeks before end of term).

A student has been away from school for a significant period of time.

A student who is below 50% and needs to provide further evidence to pass the subject.

<u>Insufficient Evidence:</u> When an IE is assigned, teachers will provide an Action Plan and connect with the student, parents and caregivers to discuss the area of learning in question. The needs of the students, solutions and supports are provided in the Action Plan to help move the student forward in the learning. If the actions are not completed by the end of the Semester, a final letter grade can result in "F", a fail and a possible re enroll in the course.

<u>Student Reflections</u>: Students will complete reflections through the My Spaces App in 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter. You will not see any student reflections in this current Learning Update. The reflection will reflect on the Thinking Core Competency. Students can be collecting evidence of this throughout the course at any time. Conversations about these reflections in 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter will take place between the student and home.

### NEW VAPING WEBSITE

The <u>QuitNow website</u>, funded by the Ministry of Health, has a new, dedicated mini-site and updated resources for youth interested in quitting or reducing their vaping. Feedback provided by the Youth Advisory Council at McCreary Centre Society and from young people across BC helped inform the development of these resources. 
### **BRANDON GABRIEL PROJECT**

### **Information About School Status During Inclement Weather**

Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather? If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or <a href="www.sd35.bc.ca">www.sd35.bc.ca</a>. Updates are also posted to Twitter @LangleySchools and Facebook at <a href="www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict">www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict</a>. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.
